Note: The maps within this Master Plan document are intended for planning purposes only, and do not represent legal documents. Wetland maps are a composite of wetlands information from 1) the National Wetland Inventory, conducted by the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service using aerial photography and topographic data; and 2) the Michigan Resource Inventory System (MIRIS) Land Cover interpretation from 1978 aerial photographs. These two data sets were combined using ArcInfo (GIS software). The Composite Wetland Area Map project was conducted in coordination with the Michigan Department of Environmental Quality with funds from the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency.

DISCLAIMER: The wetland map has not been field checked and should only be used for general planning purposes. This map should be used to supplement a field inventory by a qualified wetland expert. The wetland map is not a complete inventory of all the wetlands in this area. Regulated wetland areas may exist that are not included in this map. Data for the base map features were developed by MIRIS, Department of Natural Resources, 1978 PA 204. These roads, section lines/numbers, and water features were digitized from the U.S.G.S. topographic quadrangle maps.

The major and minor watershed basin boundaries were delineated on U.S.G.S. topographic quadrangle maps and digitized by the Department of Environmental Quality, Land and Water Management Division. The sub-watershed basin boundaries were delineated on U.S.G.S. topographic quadrangle maps and digitized by the Northwest Michigan Council of Governments.
